## Faculty



**Daniel J. Briceland, MD**, was elected American Academy of Ophthalmology's Senior Secretary for Advocacy in 2015. He is a graduate of the Academy's Leadership Development

Program, LDP2, class of 2000. Dr. Briceland also serves on the Academy's Executive Committee. Dr. Briceland previously served as the Academy's Secretary for State Affairs, and as an Associate for Secretary for State Affairs. Additionally, he previously was a member of the Academy's Nominating Committee, Awards Committee and Committee on Aging. He served for six years as director of the Academy's Leadership Development Program, overseeing the development of future leaders of state, subspecialty, and specialized interest societies and continues to be involved in this effort.

Dr. Briceland has been an Ophthalmic Mutual Insurance Company Director since 2012, with leadership roles on the Executive, Audit, Reinsurance, and Claims Committees.

**Donald L. Budenz, MD, MPH**, received his medical degree from Harvard Medical School, USA. He completed an ophthalmology residency at the University of Pennsylvania, Scheie Eye Institute, USA.



Dr Budenz then completed a Heed Foundation Fellowship in glaucoma at the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute, University of Miami School of Medicine, USA, where he subsequently was a faculty member for 17 years. In 2004, he received a Masters in Public Health from the Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health. He is currently the Kittner Distinguished Professor and Chairman of Ophthalmology at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, USA.

Dr. Budenz is an editorial reviewer for numerous medical journals, is on the Editorial Board of the *American Journal of Ophthalmology* and the *Journal of Glaucoma*, as well as

serving as the Editor of the Glaucoma issue of *Current Opinion in Ophthalmology*. He has been principal investigator in numerous glaucoma clinical trials. Concurrent with his research, Dr Budenz has been published widely in the field of glaucoma; he has authored a textbook, *Atlas of Visual Fields*, contributed chapters to several other books, and written or coauthored 250 peer-reviewed journal articles.

Dr. Budenz is the recipient of a Golden Apple Award for Best Resident Teacher (University of Pennsylvania, School of Medicine) and has received the teaching award for Best Course in the Department of Epidemiology and Public Health at the University of Miami. He has received Humanitarian of the Year awards from the American Academy of Ophthalmology and American Glaucoma Society for his work in Ghana, West Africa.



**Sumitra S. Khandelwal, MD** is an Associate Professor at the Cullen Eye Institute, Baylor College of Medicine where she specializes in cornea, cataract and refractive surgery. She also

serves as the Medical Director for the Lions Eye Bank of Texas. She completed her ophthalmology residency at Emory University in Atlanta followed by a one-year fellowship at Lindstrom fellowship at Minnesota Eye Consultants.

She was awarded the Early Career Faculty Award for Excellence in Patient Care at Baylor College of Medicine and the ASCRS-ESCRS Young Ophthalmologist Exchange Program Award. She is the chair if the ASCRS Complex Cataract Subcommittee and co-chair the annual ASCRS Combined Ophthalmic Symposium summer program which will be held in Nashville this year. She serves as chair of the Cedars Aspens Education Committee and on the American European Congress of Ophthalmic Surgeon (AECOS) education committee. Her clinical and research interested including optimization of cornea and cataract surgery, treatment options for keratoconus and providing education for residents, fellows and her peers.



**David A. Plager, MD**, has delivered over 250 lectures nationally and internationally on a wide range of topics in pediatric ophthalmology: from cataracts to glaucoma to

vascular malformations and on a wide range of strabismus topics- he has a particular interest in the treatment of oblique muscle dysfunction. He has published or coauthored over 100 scientific articles in peer-reviewed journals, 15 book chapters and was editor and co-author of the textbook *Strabismus Surgery: Basic and Advanced Strategies*. He has received research grants for work in ROP, pediatric cataracts and pediatric glaucoma.

Dr. Plager was President of AAPOS in 2011 and served on the AAPOS Board of Directors for 12 years as Director at Large and Councilor to the AAO. He has chaired the AAPOS Finance, Corporate Relations and Long Range Planning committees. AAPOS has awarded him its Honor, Senior Honor and Lifetime Achievement Awards.



**Dr. Sunil Srivastava** is an ophthalmologist in Cleveland, Ohio and is affiliated with multiple hospitals in the area, including Cleveland Clinic and MetroHealth Medical

Center. He received his medical degree from University at Buffalo, School of Medicine and Biomedical Sciences and has been in practice between 11-20 years. His Specialty Interests are Vitreoretinal surgery and medical treatment of retinal disorders, ocular inflammatory diseases including uveitis, and retinal infectious diseases. He did his Fellowship at Duke University Medical Center in Vitreo-retinal Surgery in 2005 and at the National Institutes of Health in Uveitis/Medical Retina in 2003.

His Residency was at Emory University Hospitals and School of Medicine and his Internship at Saint Vincent's Hospital and Medical Center in Internal Medicine in New York, NY.
